#### **OBJECTIVES**

To lead the student to examine the acquisition of natural languages, with a particular focus on (I) morphology and syntax, (II) the types of structures that are internalized and their mental representations (L1 or Interlanguage), (III) and the course of language acquisition over time.

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

This course presents the main theories of natural language acquisition, with a focus on L2 acquisition, the theoretical models for describing natural languages, and their implications for acquisition.

  - Critical periods and the access to UG
- 5. Syntax and Morphology in Generative SLA
  - Acquisition of syntactic structures in L2
  - Morphological development and UG principles

- 6. Recent Advances and Research Methods in Generative SLA
  - o Current research trends in generative approaches to SLA
